In his talk "Getting the Carbon Out: Why Climate Friendly Development is Good Business," Dr. Dan Kammen will examine the current state of California and global decarbonization efforts, and why removing fossil fuel use is a pro-business and pro-health endeavor. Dr. Kammen is the Class of 1935 Distinguished Professor of Energy at UCB and a climate advisor for the Obama administration. He has served as a contributing or coordinating lead author on various reports of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change since 1999. The IPCC shared the 2007 Nobel Peace Prize. Kammen has appeared on 60 Minutes (twice), Nova, Frontline, and hosted the six-part Discovery Channel series Ecopolis. Dr. Kammen is a Permanent Fellow of the African Academy of Sciences and a fellow of the American Physical Society.




