



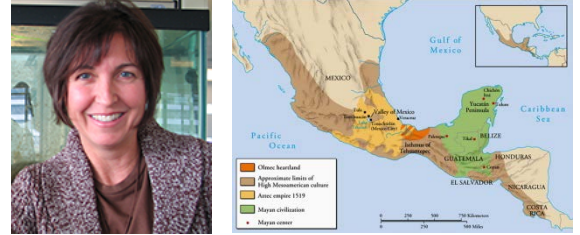

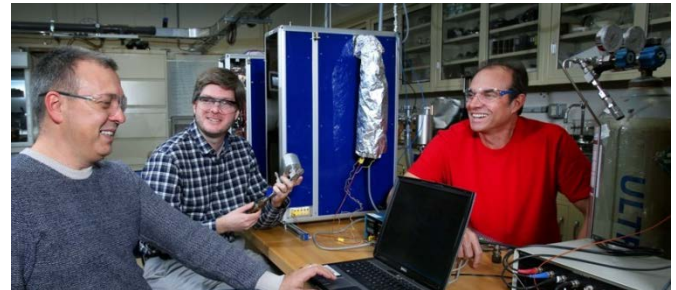
Friday, Sept, 28, 2018, Professor Dan Kasen (UCB and LBNL) interests are supernovae and other astronomical explosions.

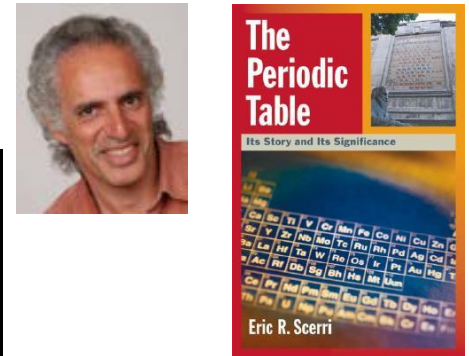

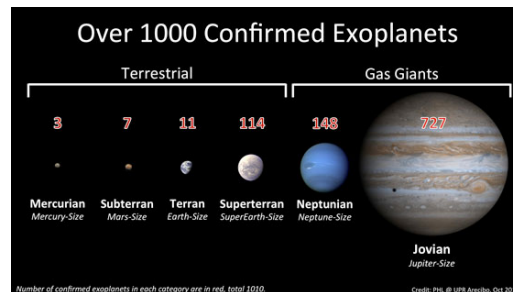
